

Feasibility Study Update
Tuesday, November 17, 2015

The architect and representatives of the district administration and board met with John Beddia, architect from Crabtree, Rohrbaugh & Associates at the Central Valley Middle School. After touring the building we broke into small groups and discussed individual ideas on guiding principles that every member was asked to show up with. Those ideas were paired down and shared in the large group setting to identify similar ideas. The following is the initial list of guiding principals in no particular order. Further meetings with the administrative team and design team will take place to ensure all educational program needs are addressed. These will be the principles by which options and ideas will be evaluated:

- Air conditioning or some solution to air flow in each building
- Technology infrastructure
- Lab spaces/STEM spaces
- Maintaining grade configurations (K-2, 3-5, 6-8, 9-12) and the current middle school concept
- Security upgrades; Building Access and Site Safety including traffic (drop off and pick up)
- Space for all day Kindergarten
- Departmentalized spaces to include upgrades to the practical and related arts (music, art, FCS, etc....)
- Large group instruction spaces; flexible spaces
- Upgrades to auditorium, gymnasium, locker rooms (field house)
- Football, soccer, baseball, softball stadium upgrades (turf and lights)

Four areas that will require additional discussion as the architects began designing options moving forward:

- New vs. Renovation
- One campus vs. Multiple locations
- Prioritizing Projects
- Budget

District architect and myself met with members of the community engagement team on Tuesday, November 24, 2015 to share an update of the feasibility study as of the Tuesday, November 27, 2015 board workshop.

Updates to the study will be presented and posted sometime after the New Year.
