Brandi Patterson	Pinehaven Ct	I understand you are working closely with the PA Dept. of Health, but the clarification on its guidance for mask-wearing in schools with mandating that students wear face coverings even when they are practicing social distancing, contradicts the CDC guidelines where the use of cloth face coverings is especially important when social distancing is difficult to maintain. If social distancing of 6 ft and plexi-glass is in place, social distancing will not prove difficult especially while children are seated. Will we see some flexibility with this within the classroom while children are seated and in place? Will it be up to teacher's discretion? Will we wait until the Dept of Health lifts this guideline, or is there plan to gear more towards the CDC guidelines? While I see the value in masking, if socially distancing is practiced, and seemingly, as it sounds, solidly in place in most if not all areas, how we can expect children, of any and all ages, to be masked all day? In addition, what types of reprimanding will be involved with masking or lack there of for the little ones? Thank you again for your time and efforts.
		How will teachers balance those students in person or synchronous? This will certainly be more time consuming, but I'm told that the district hasn't discussed that yet and hadn't considered it?

I have been keeping up to date and reading the information that has been released through the school district's website. I wanted to make a comment about the parent survey results. I appreciate that the results were quickly uploaded and disseminated to the parents. However, I feel that the format that they are in is not particularly helpful. You have given us the results for the entire school population. I'm assuming that depending on the grade level of the child, the parent responses may change. I think that the results should be given to the parents based on grade level so they are able to make a more informed decision. With my son entering an elementary grade level, I may see more parents preferring traditional instruction which may change my opinion on if I feel it is safe for him to return. It's noted that every attempt will be made to keep class sizes less than 25, but truly if you are going to encourage social distancing, class sizes need to be much smaller. Also, I feel like there's a lack of guidance for those parents interested in the hybrid method of learning. If there isn't some guidance on which days you should send your child to school then you may not actually decrease the size of classes if most parents choose to send their children on the same day. If some guidance was given to these parents who would like to pursue synchronous online learning plus in person teaching a couple days a week then you could theoretically maintain lower class sizes while still offering the traditional teaching option for some children.

According to the PA Department of Education Instruction Model guidelines posted on August 10th and the posted levels of community spread of COVID-19 from the PA Department of Health for Beaver County (moderate spread) the guidelines state that only Blended/Hybrid or Full Remote instruction methods are recommended for Beaver County. The PA Department of Education defines Blended/hybrid as "any Model in which the number of students in a school building is reduced to allow for social distancing of 6 feet". Because the current method of instruction in the CVSD reopening plan does not guarantee "6 foot social distancing", ("if possible" is listed numerous times in the plan when speaking to social distancing) it would not qualify as a Blended or Hybrid model as defined by the state. My home address is 100 Tiger Lilly Drive, Aliquippa. I have a few questions:

- What is the preliminary breakdown of instructional pathway options chosen in the middle school by grade and team? How is it possible to plan for social distancing when the teachers don't know who is going to be in the building each day? Why not just start with a hybrid plan so the school knows how many children will attend each day and can plan accordingly?
- The latest information from the state says that students must be spaced six feet apart to remove masks to eat. Is this spacing possible in the CV cafeterias, especially if the number of students attending each day is unknown? Will other spaces be used for lunch?
- What happens if our home Comcast internet goes out (this happens frequently) during synchronous class? Are classes going to be recorded and made available for later viewing?
- What is the notification plan for when a student or teacher tests positive for COVID? I understand that the Department of Health will do contact tracing, but beyond that, will all parents be notified that there are positive cases in the school community? This information would go a long way in helping parents to decide whether to send their child to school on any given day.

Statement from Tracy Whipkey, President Central Valley Education Association

Beginning the new school year in a pandemic is causing apprehension for many teachers, parents, and students. After reviewing the District's "Return to School Health and Safety Plan", an overwhelming majority of teachers have expressed concern over deficiencies in the plan related to social distancing and confirmation of COVID cases. Teachers fear that by not addressing these two specific issues, there is **no way** to ensure a safe and healthy learning environment.

The District has opted for the most aggressive return to school plan but is only committed to the bare minimum CDC recommended mitigation efforts. CVEA believes the District can and should do more – be proactive! We have already witnessed other Beaver County districts modeling transparency in keeping parents informed of positive COVID cases and believe our District should do the same. It is imperative that the District keep staff and parents informed of positive cases as they arise. Being proactive enables parents to make educated and informed decisions regarding education and athletic choices for their child(ren).

For the safety of our students and community, we encourage the District to consider an alternative return plan as most other county districts have already done. Please also refer to the attached letter to Superintendent Perry from PSEA President Rich Askey to see specific recommendations for social distancing and quarantine protocols.
